### **8.1 Naomi Agius - Aboriginal and Community Development Officer (City of Playford)**

- Been with City of Playford for six (6) years
- Share with the community
- Health services – links and referrals to services
- Aboriginal Studies – confirmation of Aboriginality support
- Free training available
  - e.g. driver education
  - First Aid courses
  - Ran training responding to Abuse and Neglect
- Other organisations to use the centre for training
- Team meetings
- The front Office Space
  - used for parents meetings
  - Free computer and internet use
- Elizabeth Rise have cooking classes and Health information
- Elizabeth Rise
  - NDIS queries and
  - Events;

### **8.2 SAPOL Report by officers Sally Milburn and David Vandraa**

- Less on Community Base more being proactive

- Teams will be in place at this stage until June 2019
- Bikes are a nuisance
  - Explained the reason why unable to chase these riders
  - Copper taken is hard to catch the perpetrators
  - Have issued many fines for speeding and drug use has increased
  - Graffiti around the Town Park has increased
  - Needs more lighting
  - Working with Council regarding these improvements.

### **8.3 Melinda Rendell (DSCI)**

#### **Project Update**

- Informed the group it is now S A Housing Authority and no longer part of Department of Human Service
- Significant change – new Minister, new Board
- Focus;
  - Public Housing sector working together
  - Acknowledgement that housing stock levels do not meet current demand / need for public housing
- Home visits are completed once per year at a minimum and Northern Adelaide are generally up to date with these.
- New process in development for responding to anti-social behaviour:
  - Current process has many levels / steps
  - New system provides opportunity for staff to address the most serious and frequent complaints
- Homelessness in the North
  - Shelter workshops in the North earlier this year discussed rough sleepers in the northern suburbs
  - Homelessness and Violence against Women Collaboration (Non-government organisations, government and Council) are exploring ways of addressing homelessness, including whether completing a rough sleeper count would provide us with more accurate information on who is requiring a service.
- **Melinda informed the meeting she is leaving the position until the end of 2018 for a role in the South.**
