## **8. GUEST SPEAKER**

### **Reverend Bryan Sellers – Northern Communities of Hope (NCOH)**

- NCOH was formed in 2002 two Churches; Elizabeth Church of Christ and Hewett Church of Christ
- They wanted something in the area
- Started at Colonel Light Gardens
- To start was on a part time basis in 2002 and is still part time today
- A first place of Community Outreach was in a Housing Trust house in Saxon Street, Smithfield Plains
- Ran quite a few groups from there
- Ran Community Lunches on a Friday, this is still going today
- In 2006 the old Davoren Park scout Hall was sought
- At this time there was much to be repaired e.g. the hall was planned to be demolished by Playford Council, stage to be made safe and much renovating to be one
- November 2007 the hall was fitted out for community use
- Target groups; people in low socio economic living situations
- Approval had to be sought from Council
- Last year was the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the centre
- Bryan has been privileged to be involved in the Playford Council Anzac Day Dawn Service in Smithfield for over 10 years
- Youth Outreach t at risk teenagers has been operating out of the Community Shopfront in the Davoren Park South Shopping Centre
