## 9. GUEST SPEAKER:

**Roxanne Withers (COP Volunteer Co-ordinator) – Volunteering in Playford**

- **New ‘Leash’ on Life program.** Roxanne provided an overview of the program that supports older people who are no longer able to walk their dogs by matching them with a volunteer dog walker. Roxanne spoke of how this program has benefitted both the volunteers and the person needing assistance. One of the examples provided was a Men’s Shed participant who had been retrenched from Holden’s and lost his dog. The dog walking has assisted him to remain active and connected to others in the community. When the client became very unwell recently he was able to let Council know and assist them which is a positive example of building community capacity.
- The program currently has 14 dogs – 10 volunteers.
- **Building stronger communities through Volunteering**
- In Playford nearly 100,000 hours @ \$40 per hour means saving of \$4 million to Playford
- We have 580 volunteers and 40 roles
- Top three reasons why people volunteer in Playford to help others, Keep people active, personal satisfaction
- Volunteer contribution statistics 16,000 meals plus 8,000 frozen meals from the Grenville Centre and 25,000 trips, 200 Garden tidied through Home Assist
- Delivered VSTAR project over the last 2 years funded by Office for Recreation Sport to support volunteer management in sporting clubs in Playford
- International Playford Tennis tournament great opportunity for the community to volunteer at an international event – 25 volunteers, 50 ball kids those who volunteered in the first year returned as they really enjoyed the experience
- Positive Futures Expo 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2019 being held at the John McVeity Centre which is focused on employment, training, volunteering and social options for people with disability.

#### **Marketing:**

- Next Works - 3G6 and 3G7 small lot housing.
- Next works – Stage 3H – a total of 88 lots to be delivered in 3 stages. Design works progressing. Bulk earthworks to commence shortly.
