- Have over 900 staff and 500 volunteers in south Australia
- Some programs have a worker one or two days a week at Smithfield office
- Mental Health program is gradually losing funds as it transitions to NDIS by middle of 2019
- Mental Health clients finding it harder to get into NDIS
- Disability clients are transitioning easier
- Respite for carers, cannot take on new clients due to NDIS
- Mental Health clients now must have a NDIS plan to get support
- Refugee support new and emerging community program
- Financial counselling attends 3 days a week
- Interest free loans may be able to get there is a process to go through
- Pilot program concerning dentistry –
- School help with fees etc. NILS loan
- Step up interest loan over 3 years
- Lawyer consumer credit
- Savings and education on utility accounts, home audits
- Youth and family counselling support
