How does it work?

Bookings can be made by calling City of Playford. We kindly ask for as much notice as possible when booking trips and at least three business days' notice to arrange last minute requests, to ensure we have capacity to complete the trip. Please note: Capacity can be reached ahead of this time frame.

Your trip will be confirmed with you by text message or phone call confirmation and a volunteer driver will collect you from your door.

When can I travel?

Operating hours are from **8:30am to 3:00pm, Monday to Friday**. Outside of these hours availability is assessed on a case by case basis.

What is Community Transport SA?

Community Transport SA (CTSA) is funded by the **South Australian Government Department of Human Services** and delivered by **City of Playford** to provide transport to people **under the age of 65** experiencing transport disadvantage who are not eligible to receive the same support through other services.

How much does it cost?

Travelled Distance	Fee each way
0-6 kms	\$4.00
7-12 kms	\$7.00
13-20 kms	\$10.00
21-35 kms	\$15.00
36-50 kms	\$20.00

Inability to pay will not mean refusal of service for eligible clients. Fee waivers or reductions may be available on a case by case basis.

Who is eligible?

The service is available to people living in:

- City of Playford
- City of Salisbury
- City of Tea Tree Gully,
- Town of Gawler

And who are:

- Unable to access public transport due to distance, functional disability, mobility limitations, financial disadvantage, and/or availability or accessibility of transport services.
- Unable to drive themselves.
- Unable to access another person to transport them.

We will prioritise transport for:

- People without access to other transport options or subsidies
- Individuals from Priority Access Groups such as:
 - Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples
 - People from new and emerging CALD communities
 - Unpaid carers
 - Those with functional limitations
 - LGBTIQ+ people

- South Australian Transport Subsidy Scheme (SATSS)
- National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS)
- Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP)
