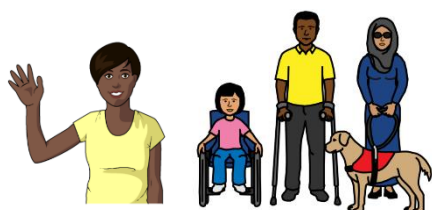

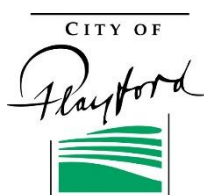

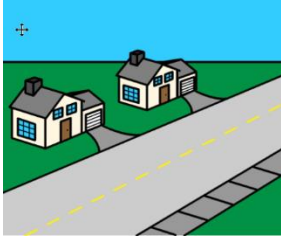

- Parks and playgrounds.



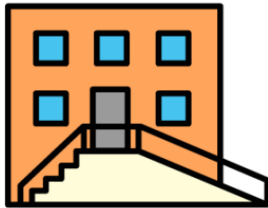
- Sport grounds and pools.



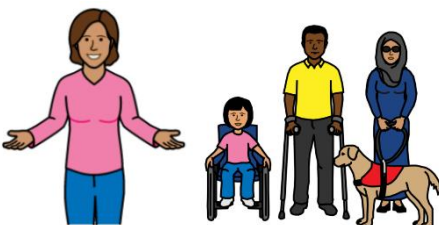
- Community events and classes.



- Volunteers.



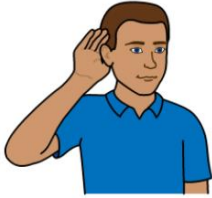
- Design of buildings.

- People with disability want to be listened to.



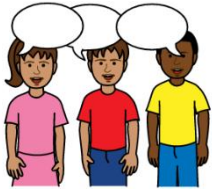
- People with disability want better information.

- Teach businesses, clubs and our workers about disability



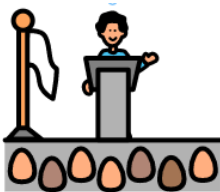
- Say thank you to businesses that welcome people with disability.



To listen to people with disability we will:



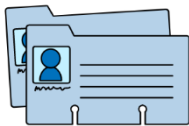
- Let people know we have a worker to help people with disability.



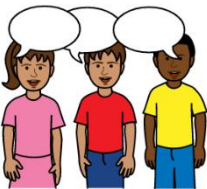
- Help people with disability to be leaders.



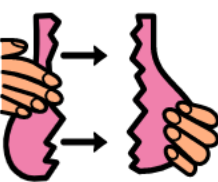
- Talk to people with disability when we start big projects.

- Listen to people and help fix problems.



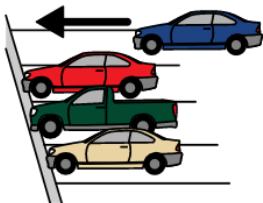
To make it easy to move around we will:



- Make footpaths easy to use.



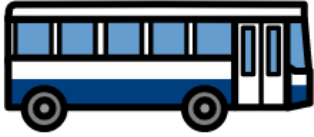
- Make buildings easy to get in to.

- Help people with disability with what they need to work.



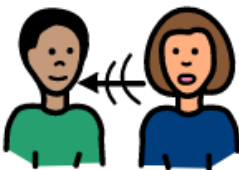
How we will make this plan happen



- The City of Playford will look after this plan.



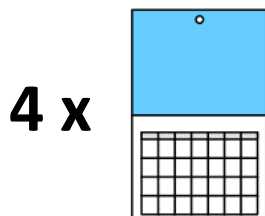
- We will talk and work with lots of people.
