

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT GRENVILLE HUB? FAQ



The move to temporary accommodation in the Civic Centre

When is the Grenville moving to temporary accommodation?

The Grenville Hub will soon be relocating to temporary accommodation in the Playford Civic Centre function rooms ahead of the new Grenville build which commences in early 2019. The current Grenville Hub building will close for business on Friday 21 December 2018 at 1.30pm (after meal service).

What about the Grenville's usual end of year events?

The Grenville will still host the traditional Christmas Day lunch for vulnerable people at the existing Grenville location on 25 December 2018. In addition, the New Year's Eve dance, run by the Munno Para Caledonia Society, will also go ahead as planned for the evening of 31 December 2018. After these events are completed, the building will be decommissioned in preparation for commencing the build of the new Playford CBD hotel.

When will the Grenville open for business at the temporary location?

The move to the new temporary accommodation will occur during the holiday break in early January 2019. During the build of the new Grenville, all Grenville services will operate from the Playford Civic Centre function rooms which are being fitted out to make sure services to the community continue business as usual. Grenville Hub operations at the Civic Centre will officially open to the public on Monday 21 January 2019.

Will all of the same services and activities be provided in the temporary location?

Yes. It will be business as usual. The Playford Civic Centre function rooms include a fully functioning commercial kitchen and a large space for dining. There will be a stage and wooden dance floor area and various activity spaces for all of the different activities to run as they do currently.

What about staff and volunteers?

The same staff and volunteers will be looking after customers and delivering the usual services once the temporary home is established. Where will Home Assist operate from?

Home Assist will be relocating to The Precinct at 112 Coventry Road, Smithfield Plains. The Precinct is Playford's new home for a range of community services such as the recently launched Healthy Food Co. It will also be the new home for Playford's Men's Shed and a number of other future community focussed services. Rest assured you will still be able to access the full range of Home Assist services. Home Assist's contact number remains the same (8256 0355) for booking services, accepting eftpos payments and answering your queries. A Home Assist staff member will also be on hand every day at the Civic Centre location and of course you can always enquire about their services with staff at the Grenville.

Where can we park?

Grenville Hub members and Grenville volunteers are eligible for free parking, providing they are attending the Grenville Hub and have their ticket validated at the Grenville. For full details about the new Windsor Carpark, ask for a copy of the Windsor Carpark FAQs available at the Grenville, Civic Centre and other City of Playford locations. There will continue to be parking available along Prince Charles Street and behind the Civic Centre. Additional disability car parking will be mapped out around the Civic Centre prior to the move. Primary consideration will be given to locating these parks as close to the Civic Centre as possible to ensure ease of use by Grenville patrons with reduced mobility.
