

Playford Alive Community Reference Group (CRG) INFORMATION SHEET

In February 2006 the State Government announced a \$1 billion rejuvenation of Adelaide's outer northern suburbs. The Playford Alive urban renewal project involves the regeneration of the Peachey Belt (Davoren Park and Smithfield Plains) and the development of broadacre land in Munno Para, Andrews Farm and Penfield.

The Playford Alive Project is a partnership between Renewal SA, Department for Communities and Social Inclusion (DCSI) and the City of Playford.

Playford Alive is delivering an integrated approach to rejuvenate the existing and new communities through the renovation of existing Government owned housing, development of new homes, new schools, health facilities and shopping centres, recreational areas, access to training and employment opportunities and improved accessibility to public transport.

Playford Alive is expected to run for 15 years with the development of more than 9,000 new homes and population growth from 13,000 to more than 40,000 people.

The Project partners have a strong commitment to engaging the local community as the project continues to develop and seeks nominations to the CRG.

The CRG has been operating since 2007.

Role:

The primary role of the CRG is to consult with the Playford Alive community and advocate on their behalf, assist the Project Partners to engage with the wider community for input into the project and encourage positive debate. Sharing of project information to the community is a key role of members.

Membership:

Nomination for membership on the CRG and application forms should be forwarded to the Project Manager by close of business on Monday 2 July 2018.

Term of appointment is for two years and previous members may re-nominate.

Time commitment will be an evening meeting once a month with possible additional commitment of 2-3 hours per week.

Local community organisation representatives are asked to ensure the group they represent are kept informed of CRG activities.

Selection Criteria

Applications will be reviewed by a Panel determined by the Project Partners.

Membership of the CRG will contain a balance of new and experienced members so that the group reflects the broad diversity of the Playford Alive community. The selection criteria will include:

- Residence or involvement in (volunteering or working in the Playford Alive Project area)
- Assessment against the Position Description criteria.

The CRG should comprise of up to 15 members.

The CRG allows for a number of Ex-Officio members who participate in the business of the group without voting rights. These include:

- Representatives from the City of Playford, Renewal SA and Department for Communities and Social Inclusion

Executive Roles:

Members of the CRG will elect a Chairperson, a Vice Chairperson and Secretary.

External Representation:

CRG representatives may be represented on other committees as agreed to by the project partners.

Training

Playford Alive acknowledges the importance of the CRG receiving appropriate training and development opportunities as an investment in the future of the Group and their role within the Playford Alive community.

The CRG will undertake a skills audit of the members and use the audit to develop a training schedule for the CRG.
