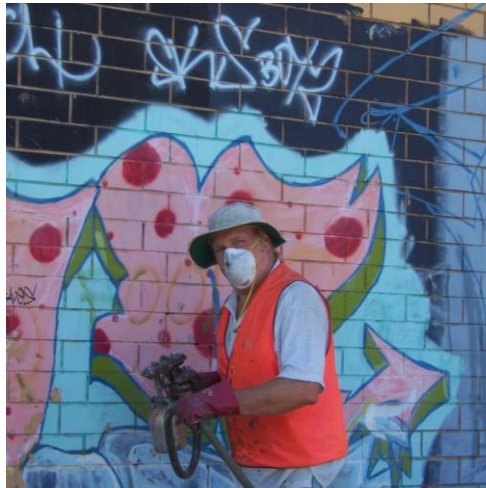


Healthy Food Co – Elizabeth Downs

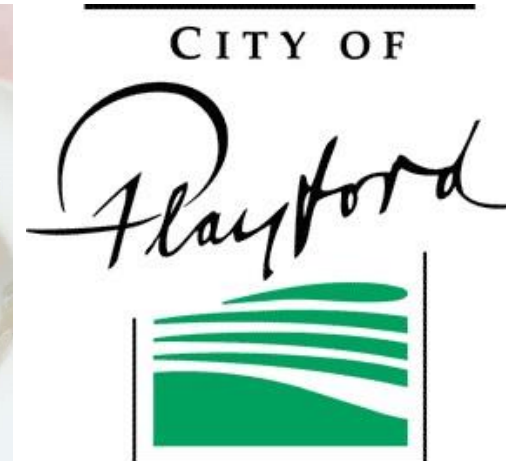


Playford North Kookaburra's & Malpa Group
