



NOTICE TO RESIDENTS FOOTPATH WORKS ON GRAEBER ROAD, SMITHFIELD

The City of Playford is pleased to inform you that footpath renewal works on **GRAEBER ROAD, SMITHFIELD** are about to commence as part of Council's Capital Works Program. This work involves the renewal of the existing footpath, as well as the upgrade of kerb ramps for accessibility compliance. Kerb-Tec have been contracted by Council to complete this work.

WHEN WILL WORK START?

Work in your street will commence on **21/10/2025** and is expected to be completed on the **28/10/2025**. Wet weather may delay the scheduling of these works.

HOW WILL THIS AFFECT ME?

At times, construction works may impact your ability to access your driveway / residence. Kerb-Tec will work with residents to ensure there is as little inconvenience as possible. Footpaths may also be closed to pedestrians during construction but will be reopened once completed. Traffic control signs and speed restrictions will be in place to ensure the safety of pedestrians and motorists.

During footpath replacement works it is not uncommon for existing stormwater pipes located under the footpath to sustain damage during demolition. These will be replaced by the contractor during the course of the work if this occurs.

If there is any work that involves the section of your driveway that crosses over the new footpath, Kerb-Tec will excavate your driveway and may temporarily fill this with quarry materials until the driveway is reinstated.

HOW CAN I HELP?

Please clearly mark any irrigation pipes or sprinkler heads you have on the Council verge.

If you have a hedge or any other vegetation which intrudes onto the verge, it would be appreciated if these could be cut back to allow Kerb-Tec unrestricted access.
